White Night

Come and join in with the artists and idealists in Brighton & Hove's unique all night free arts festival to mark the clocks going back; this year themed around utopias. More than 70 separate events from the fanciful to the factual aim to inspire you to reach for perfection.

Each year we invite you to join with artists, programmers, thinkers and do-ers to reclaim Saturday night in the city and do something different in the middle of the night. The festival celebrates the cultural DNA of Brighton & Hove – creative, diverse, quirky, clever, gregarious and curious – eager to get active, get involved, try something new...and stay up all night.

White Night has a focus on new work and new approaches and this year we have 14 new commissions from the city's artists and an additional 50 events made especially for the night. The festival celebrates the vibrant year round offer of the city from the grandest venues to the smallest community spaces. This year the festival takes place in streets, squares and parks, on the seafront, on your smartphone and in venues ranging from a royal palace to a launderette.

Artists have also responded to social and political concerns with new approaches to working with older people and excluded young people alongside projects dealing with road safety, sustainable food, saving the planet and saving yourself.

There are lots of opportunities to get involved, in the lead up as well as on the night. Join White Night's online communities on Facebook and Twitter or visit the White Night website on your computer or phone to plan your perfect night.

White Night's sister festival is Nuit Blanche Amiens in France: a collaboration made possible by the EU Interreg IVA France (Channel) – England programme.

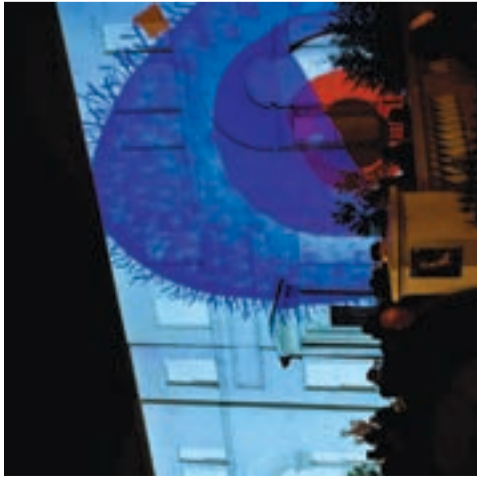
33 Pedal Cinema

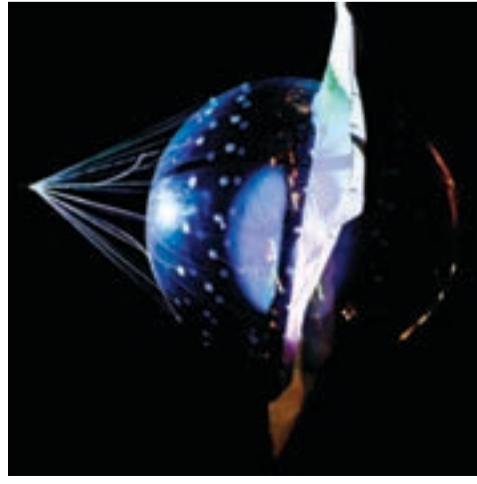

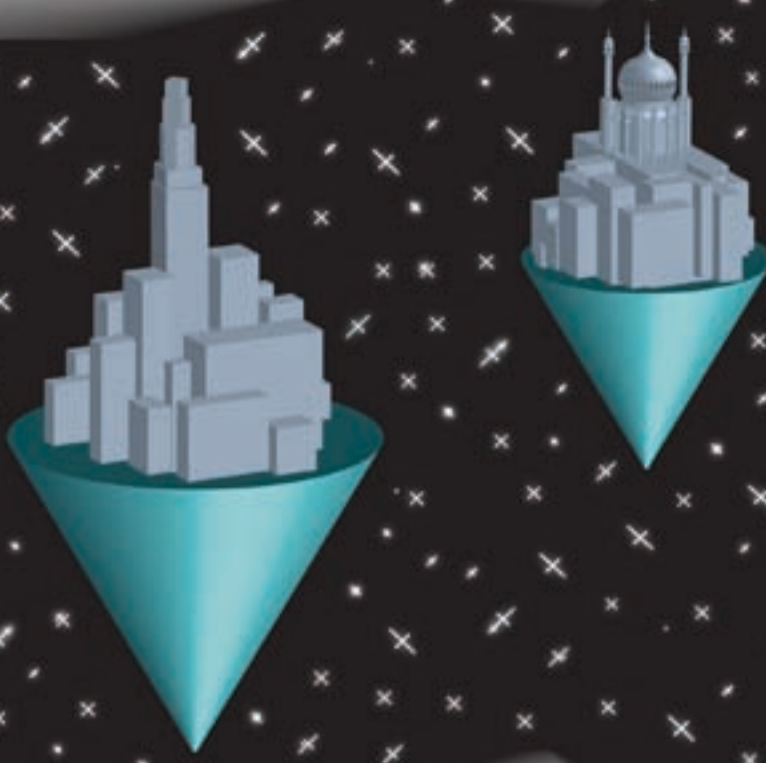
